The priority public retains access to all outdoor and indoor sports facilities (as well as private structures) and collective changing rooms, in compliance with the curfew and the conditions laid down by health protocols. These are the:

- professional sportsmen and women
- high-level sportsmen and women
- school and extracurricular groups
- persons undergoing university or professional training
- people with a medical prescription with the Allocation personnalisée d'autonomie (APA) and people with a disability recognised by the Maison départementale des personnes handicapées (MDPH) as well as the supervision required for their practice.

The practice of sport remains prohibited for non-priority major groups in covered areas. In the outdoor sports facilities, Closed. (discussions on 20 January for possible reopening in February If conditions allow it)

Employment support:

 Partial activity: employer receives an allowance equivalent to a share of the hourly pay of the employee placed in partial employment. The employee receives a partial activity allowance from his employer in lieu of his salary for the period during which he is placed in partial activity.

Invoices and charges:

- <u>Social security charges</u>: deferral of URSSAF contributions and supplementary pensions
- <u>Tax charges</u>: deferral of VAT and direct taxes
- Rents and suppliers: In the event of payment difficulties or late payment of rent, companies that do not reach an agreement with their landlord may resort to non-judicial mediation procedures.

Funding:

- <u>Solidarity Fund:</u> The amount of assistance paid is calculated differently depending on the month in question and on the situation of the enterprise.
- State-guaranteed loans: The Government is implementing an exceptional guarantee scheme of €300 billion to support bank financing for businesses. It will be possible to take out such loans until 30 June 2021. Except in exceptional cases, this loan may represent up to 25% of the last closed financial year (a priori 2018, 2019 or 2020), or two years of payroll for innovative companies or companies created since 1 January 2019. No repayment will be required in the first year.

Micro-enterprises and SMEs of all types, including freelancers and sole proprietorships, can benefit from a moratorium on a total volume of loans estimated at around 220Mds€.

<u>Liquidity shortages and facilitate access to financing</u>

SACE S.p.A. issues guarantees for loans granted to companies of any size (200billion€ of which 30billion€ for SMEs).

Central Guarantee Fund ("Fondo centrale di garanzia")

Until 31 December 2020 the Central Fund issued guarantees, free of charge, to companies with less than 499 employees and in relation to loans with an amount up to 5millions€.

<u>-Measures to support export, internationalization and investment by businesses:</u> A co-insurance system has been introduced. The state will assume 90 percent of the non-market risks (as defined in EU legislation) attached to the guarantees issued by SACE; the remaining 10 percent will be assumed by the company that receives the SACE-backed loan

<u>-Start-ups:</u> State guarantee of up to €5m for small and medium-sized businesses. The State, through the Central Guarantee Fund for SMEs, provides a guarantee, free of charge, for a single enterprise, up to 5 million euros, aimed at financing operations.
